## **CARLA WILLIAMS-SCOTT** Director, Department of Neighborhoods



Carla Williams-Scott was appointed the first director of the Department of Neighborhoods in June 2016. She previously served as the assistant director of Economic Development and Community Partnerships for Franklin County. In her role, she managed the Board of Commissioners Community Partnership Grant program, a \$16 million portfolio that provides support to local community-based organizations that serve county residents. In addition to the Community Partnership program, she managed the People Works Workforce Development Program, which assists low-income county residents to obtain full-time living-wage jobs and career pathways leading out of poverty. Prior to joining Franklin County Economic Development & Planning, she served as the assistant director for Franklin County Job & Family Services where she managed Publicly Funded Child Care, Workforce Development, Development Support Services and Quality Support Services for the agency.

Prior to joining Franklin County, Carla served as the assistant director for the City of Columbus Department of Development, Legislation and Contracts and Neighborhood Services. In this role, she managed both the Legislation and Contracts and Neighborhood Services divisions. Those units were responsible for overseeing all aspects of the department's legislative and contracts process, including developing, reviewing and monitoring contract compliance. In addition, she provided oversight to the five outreach offices (Neighborhood Pride Centers) and the Pride Center managers and liaisons for each office. These offices serve as the “face” of the City in communities throughout the greater Columbus area, and allow residents to have access to City services and staff in their community.

## Shred-it Day results ...

It's always nice to quantify the impact a particular Club effort has on the community. Thus it is with the recently completed WCMH-TV4 "Shred-It" Day held on Saturday, May 13.

During the six-hour collection period, more than 3,000 vehicles passed through the lines, to handoff nearly 250,000 pounds of personal documents to shred and recycle. Attendees also donated more than \$10,000 to Nationwide Children's Hospital. Since the first NBC4 Shred-it Day, more than 2,545 tons of paper have been shredded and recycled and more than \$133,000 has been raised for Nationwide Children's Hospital.

Thanks to Scott Doellinger for his tireless efforts in organizing our Club volunteers and helping to organize our efforts.
