TOM FOOS President, ARMADA, Ltd.



Safety and security are growing concerns in today’s constantly changing environment. Tom brings more than 22 years of military, public administration and corporate security experience to ARMADA. Prior to establishing ARMADA, he held a number of senior positions with state government and worked in security management in the private sector. Experienced in managing departments in diverse industries, Tom’s career was focused on building customer-focused teams and long-term partnerships. Upon leaving active duty in 1993, Tom held senior staff positions for the Ohio Attorney General’s Office and the Ohio Governor’s Office. These positions included the assistant director of the Office of Criminal Justice Services and the director of the Governor’s Office of Veteran Affairs. Additionally, he served as the chief of staff for the Ohio Veterans Home Network. Mr. Foos’ most recent position prior to founding ARMADA, Ltd, in 2005, was with a Fortune 19 pharmaceutical company where he served as a global security manager. In that role, he was responsible for the security and safety functions at more than 150 business units around the world to include: laboratories, financial offices, call centers, manufacturing plants and distribution centers.

As a security manager, Mr. Foos regularly provided domestic and international security consulting and services related to: security technology integration; workplace violence program development; security project management; executive protection; and critical incident management.

## Buckeye ticket raffle off to a good start ...

In most cases, we are partnering with outside organizations (Columbus Children's Choir, several Peletons, Upper Arlington Citizen Police Academy Alumni Association, etc.) to help sell the tickets. Partner organizations will earn a \$3 commission for each ticket sold. Tickets sold by Club members will enable us to retain the full \$5.



Here's how you can help:

Ticket sales must be completed by August 19, so that we can hold the drawing at our Monday meeting on August 22, giving us time to notify the winner and allowing them time to plan for the first home game.

During his most recent deployment, he served as the commander of the U.S. Marine Security Forces that protected Camp Lemonier, which is located in Djibouti and is the only U.S. military installation on the continent of Africa. In addition to that responsibility, Tom oversaw force protection for the U.S. Embassy in Djibouti and U.S. ships utilizing the Port of Djibouti.

Tom earned his Bachelor of Arts in political science from The Ohio State University.

Kiwanis International Convention proposed amendment results ...

An important part of every Kiwanis International Convention is the House of Delegates and the votes cast by the elected delegates. Kiwanis Club of Columbus was officially represented by President-elect **Jack D'Aurora** and Vice President **Chad Endsley**. Also in attendance were **Scott Lindsey**, **Ted Coons** and **Lynn Coons**.

Here are the results of the votes taken on the proposed amendments to the by-laws of Kiwanis International:

- 1 – **Auxiliary bodies. Purpose:** To eliminate obsolete and potentially confusing wording regarding auxiliary bodies of Kiwanis International. **Approved.**
- 2 – **Use of Kiwanis name and marks. Purpose:** To clarify Kiwanis International's authority regarding use of the Kiwanis name and marks as it relates to foundations and other affiliated entities, including intellectual property. **Approved as amended**
- 3 – **Kiwanis International affiliates and subsidiaries. Purpose:** To codify Kiwanis International "affiliates," which are regions or other groups composed of clubs and districts, and "subsidiaries," which are wholly-owned organizations and business entities. **Approved.**
- 4 – **District Treasurer Purpose:** To revise the term and selection process for district treasurers in order to align districts with KI's strategic plan and to provide better oversight over district funds, assets and financial operations. **Defeated.**
- 5 – **Annual adjustment option for Kiwanis International dues. Purpose:** To provide that KI dues may be adjusted by no more than \$2 annually, with a cap of \$5 over a five-year period, to keep up with inflation. **Defeated.**
- 6 – **Secure web-based voting for Kiwanis International business. Purpose:** To provide that the business of KI decided by delegates will be conducted by secure electronic voting, thereby giving an equal voice to all Kiwanis clubs. **Defeated.**
- 7 – **Tiered dues. Purpose:** To base tiered dues on a percentage of the gross national income of the U.S. **Defeated.**
- 8 – **Members who belong to more than one club. Purpose:** To provide that members who belong to more than one Kiwanis club shall only pay Kiwanis International and district dues to their primary club. **Failed for lack of motion.**
- 9 – **Life membership status fee. Purpose:** To provide a variable life membership status fee based on the member's age. **Failed for lack of motion.**
- 10 – **Foundations, charitable funds, and other affiliated entities. Purpose:** To clarify KI's authority regarding foundations and affiliated entities. **Withdrawn.**
- 11 – **Delegate verification process for electronic balloting. Purpose:** To add specific processes to the bylaws regarding electronic balloting at KI conventions. **Withdrawn.**


Bueller? Bueller? Bueller?
