

Jim Foley is a native Ohioan who has lived in Columbus since 1982. He earned a bachelor’s degree in theology from the University of Notre Dame in 1974 and a Juris Doctor degree from Notre Dame in 1977. He and his wife Vicki are members of St. Timothy Parish in Columbus. They are the proud parents of four children and grandparents of three. Jim has been active in parish activities, including acting as chair of the Parish Board of Education, being a member of the Parish Council, and working with high school students in the parish. He has also worked on diocesan retreats for high school students.

Jim began as president of Cristo Rey Columbus High School on January 1, 2012. He is a member of the Board of Catholic Social Services, where he served as Board Chair from 2009 – 2012. He also sits on the Diocese of Columbus Catholic Charities Commission. Additionally, he has served on the Board of the Ohio Legal Rights Service Commission and chaired the Upper Arlington Charter Review Commission.

Before becoming president of Cristo Rey Columbus, Jim practiced law at the Columbus law firm of Vorys, Sater, Seymour and Pease LLP, where he was a partner. He has taught law as an adjunct professor at both Ohio State’s and Capital University’s law schools. He has also written for and taught at numerous legal seminars.

Prior to coming to Columbus, he was an attorney at the United States Department of Justice in Washington D.C., specializing in religious freedom and funding issues.



The Lone Ranger replies, "I see millions of stars."


"What that tell you?" asked Tonto.

Niger becomes 40th country to eliminate MNT ...

In June, World Health Organization surveys in Niger showed that the country has eliminated maternal and neonatal tetanus. Kiwanis International President Sue Petrisin shared this news with the Kiwanis family on Thursday in Toronto during her opening session remarks to the delegates at the 2016 Kiwanis International Convention. This comes just weeks after the news that Indonesia eliminated this deadly disease.

Since 1999, UNICEF and its partners have eliminated the disease in 40 countries, including Cambodia, India and Mauritania in 2015. It is great progress, but MNT still threatens families in 19 countries.
