Buckeye Football Analyst



Jeff Logan graduated from The Ohio State University in 1978 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in journalism and public relations. He was chosen as an outstanding graduate of Ohio State, Lettered four years for the Buckeyes, was part of four Big Ten Championships and played in four bowl games, including two Rose Bowls. Jeff was a two-year starter, a co-captain, twice All-Big Ten first team running back and an Academic All-American.

Known as the “running back that followed the two-time Heisman Award winner, Archie Griffin,” Jeff became just the third person in Ohio State football history to rush for more than 1,000 yards in a regular season (1976).

Jeff is a financial advisor with Lighthouse Wealth Solutions. He served 12 years on the Varsity “O” Alumni Board, where he is a past-president. He served on the selection committee for the hiring of Jim Tressel, and has been invited by current football coach Urban Meyer to speak to the football team about the transition into “real-life” after football.

He married Dena (Barry) Logan, a former OSU cheerleader, and they have two grown children, Katie and Christopher. Jeff lives in Dublin, Ohio and is actively involved with Jack Nicklaus’s Memorial Tournament. He is also a three-time former club champion at Muirfield Village.

He has done radio and television broadcasts of the Buckeyes’ football games and appears regularly as a color analyst. He speaks frequently to youth and business organizations.

3- Meal tickets can be purchased at the event by guests, members and the general public for **\$10**.

4- Kiwanis members wishing to invite a prospective member to the Regatta may **pre-purchase** meal tickets from **Paul Bohlman** or **Alison Thibaut** for **\$5**. 5- A no-meal option will also be available at our standard rate of \$4.25 pre-registered and \$5 at the door.

Kiwanis College and Career Fair ...

This will be our 37th Kiwanis College and Career Fair and it promises to be exciting due in part to our new venue. This year's event will be held at the Center of Science and Industry (COSI) located at 333 West Broad Street.

There will again be a morning session from 9 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. and an evening session from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. High school students and counselors from throughout central Ohio will be bused into the morning session in scheduled waves, while the evening session is designed for students to be brought by parents and guardians. The evening session will also include break out sessions on college financing, how to conduct a college visit and other such sessions. Dispatch Media will be distributing information about the event to nearly 250,000 homes.

Food trucks will be on-site for the evening session, and parking for the event is free.

## District Convention report ...

This past weekend, Kiwanis members from throughout Ohio converged on Wolf Creek Resort in Mason, Ohio (just north of Cincinnati).

From the 226 clubs throughout Ohio, 86 were represented by a total of 212 voting delegates. Overall Ohio District membership fell by 235 over the past 12 months, although the number of clubs remained steady. The average club size is now 33 members.

Ohio Kiwanis Governor Amy Zimmerman reported that her Governor's project has already resulted in the presentation of 63 AmTrykes to handicapped and disabled recipients.

District treasurer Al Allender reported that the District is within budget and should finish the administrative year in the black.
