## **DR. TERESA C. LONG** **City of Columbus Health Commissioner**



Dr. Teresa C. Long became the first female health commissioner for Columbus in 2002. She was appointed to the post by Mayor Michael B. Coleman and the Columbus Board of Health. Prior to this appointment, she served as medical director and assistant health commissioner for the Columbus Health Department from 1986 until 2002.

Before coming to Columbus, Dr. Long served on the front lines of the emerging AIDS epidemic as a physician specialist with the San Francisco Department of Public Health. She conducted her preventive medicine residency with the California Department of Health Services where she developed peri-natal AIDS guidelines, in addition to other duties.

Upon her arrival in Columbus, Dr. Long was instrumental in organizing both the department's and the community's response to HIV/AIDS. Her commitment and attention to this disease have been unwavering. In addition to serving on numerous boards and committees, locally, statewide and nationally, Dr. Long is a clinical associate professor at the Ohio State University College of Medicine and Public Health. She was the first recipient of the Elizabeth Blackwell Award for Pioneering Efforts to Improve Women's and Community Health. She holds a Doctor of Medicine Degree from the University of California - San Francisco and a Master's in Public Health from the University of California - Berkeley.

## Trustees establish new granting process for administrative year...

At the October Trustee meeting, Club leaders approved a new policy regarding the timing of grants from the Columbus Kiwanis Foundation. The new policy calls for decisions regarding grants to be made in February and in July, with approximately half of the annually allocated funds from the Foundation being awarded in each cycle.

Establishing the two granting cycles accomplishes several objectives including the following:

1- Community 501(c) 3 organizations will be advised of the timing so that all have ample time and opportunity to submit requests;

2- Club committees will have specific deadlines to work toward, thus creating a sense of urgency to contact and work with organizations within their area of focus;

3- Grant requests will be compared against each other, thus allowing allocated funds to be utilized in the most effective and impactful way; and

4- Trustees will be able to more efficiently focus on awarding grants during the February and July monthly meetings.

Timelines are being established that will allow for submittals to be received in a timely manner so that they can be properly evaluated before being brought to the Trustees for the final decision.

This new process is a direct result of the very successful Centennial grant process that enabled our Club to solicit, screen, review, investigate and decide the best four recipients from within the 83 submittals received.

### Update on Kiwanis International MNT elimination efforts ...

In June, Equatorial Guinea completed a survey to determine the effectiveness of its efforts and is currently awaiting results from the World Health Organization.

Haiti is preparing for a similar survey at the end of this year.

Papua New Guinea plans to conduct targeted campaigns in 15 provinces as part of its integrated and accelerated routine immunization activities.

Nigeria conducted its third round of supplemental immunization activities targeting 2.3 million women of reproductive age between September 21 and 25.
