

Hilliard Kiwanis to hold fundraiser...

On Saturday, November 4, Kiwanis Club of Hilliard will hold its annual Spaghetti Dinner and Silent Auction. The event will run from 4 p.m. to 7:30 p.m., and will be held at the Hilliard Senior Center, located at 3800 Veterans Memorial Drive in Hilliard.

The menu will include spaghetti (with Rod's secret sauce), meatball, salad, dessert and beverage for an admission price of \$8 per adult, \$7 per senior and \$4 for children ages 4-12. Children 3 and under eat for free. Why not bring the entire family, along with a few friends?



The silent auction will include a wide variety of donated items from retailers around the community. If you bring a non-perishable food item for the Hilliard Food Pantry, you will be entered in a drawing for a \$50 Kroger Gift Card.

Members of Kiwanis Club of Columbus who attend will receive an attendance credit. Should we have four or more of our members attend, we will also earn an "interclub" credit. Reservations are NOT needed; however, you must self-report your attendance to Club Secretary **Paul Bohlman** in order to receive the proper attendance credit.

Throughout the year, our Interclub Committee, chaired by **Ted Coons**, will be setting up opportunities for our members to visit Kiwanis clubs throughout Division 10-W and beyond. Each time you attend an interclub, you will receive an attendance credit and you will help our Club earn an interclub credit. That includes our portion of the bonus pool. Once we receive the final details, we will recognize those individuals who so generously supported our Foundation.

Kiwanis logo wear ...

The Ohio District is one of the original 29 districts of Kiwanis International. It came into being on September 26, 1918, in Cleveland, with 10 clubs in the district. Richard J. Birch was elected governor, and he served until October 15, 1919, when delegates at a convention in

Columbus selected Edmund F. Arras as the next governor. Arras went on to serve as International President in 1923–24.



Cleveland was the second Kiwanis club and the first club in the district. It was chartered on October 19, 1915. The second club in the district was Columbus, chartered on May 10, 1916. The third club was Dayton, chartered on May 31, 1916. A great way to show your Kiwanis pride is to wear Kiwanis branded clothing. There are several ways to obtain Kiwanis wear.
