Susan Pringle assumed her role as executive director of Columbus Children’s Theatre on January 17, 2017. She brought with her more than 20 years of nonprofit and managerial experience.

Prior to this position, Susan spent two years as a partner in her own company, In the Black. At In the Black, she provided contracting services such as strategic and development planning for nonprofit organizations. Before partnering in her own company, Susan worked for eight years in Louisville, Kentucky, at two different organizations. She was the development director for the Merton Institute, then the business manager for Green Earth Outdoors.

Notably, Susan was a figure in the Dayton community for years as the executive director of The Muse Machine, a nationally recognized arts education organization serving 70,000 students and teachers annually in southwestern Ohio. She started as the assistant program director in 1993, and became the executive director in 2002. Susan served in that position for four years, and with countless major accomplishments, such as acquiring sector-specific funding to develop integrated arts programs for K-8 students; conducting a disciplined planned giving initiative with the Dayton Foundation; and overseeing the brand position of the overall organization.

Columbus Children's Theatre is in its 55th year of operation. Their mission statement is “To inspire, enrich and empower

Celebrating Presidents' Day ...

On Monday, February 19, we will celebrate Presidents' Day by foregoing our weekly Kiwanis luncheon meeting.

Presidents' Day honors and celebrates the life and achievements of George Washington, the first President of the United States (1789-1797) and 'The Father of his Country.' The day is, in practice, often used to honor and remember all past U.S. presidents, and in particular, Washington, Abraham Lincoln and Thomas Jefferson.



Presidents' Day was created in 1879 and was first celebrated the following year. It was originally held on Washington's actual birthday (February 22). In 1971, that was changed to the third Monday of February. It was the first federal holiday to be created in honor of an American citizen.
