Online registration will require credit card payment. To pay by check please print the appropriate registration or sponsorship form and mail it, with your payment to the address on the form.

The event continues to be sponsored by the Ohio Kiwanis Foundation making a portion of the registration fee and all sponsorship donations tax-deductible; the net proceeds are being used to help support the Foundation's Safe and Healthy Kids campaign. This year's event will again be held at Tam O'Shanter Golf Course in Canton, Ohio (5055 Hills & Dales Road NW, Canton, very near I-77). As always, this event is open to the entire Kiwanis family and all friends of Kiwanis.

The format of play will be a scramble. There will be games of skill on the course with prizes. In certain categories there will be separate skill prizes for men, women and seniors. Mulligans will be available for all golfers.

The registration fee is \$85 and includes lunch, golf, cart, prizes, and a great dinner. The registration deadline is July 4.
