

**Baseball historian**

Joe Santry was born and raised in a family of ten on the east side of Columbus. He graduated from Bishop Hartley High School and attended The Ohio State University.

In 1987, Joe was named as the second official historian in professional baseball history (*the late Joe Overfield of Buffalo was the first*). He is now the dean of all baseball’s historians.

Joe is the historian, media director and the director of communications for the Columbus Clippers. He has given more than 3,000 talks during his career and has appeared and worked on many television and radio programs. He once went six weeks without being stumped on Kirk Herbstreit’s “Stump the Chump” radio trivia program. Joe has written thousands of articles on the history of sports.



An accomplished photographer, Joe has had thousands of his game photos published. He also served as an official scorer for the International League for 25 years. Joe also spent many years as a high school basketball, baseball, football and softball coach in Central Ohio.

Joe’s greatest joy in life is his daughter, Beth, and granddaughters Abby and Katie.

Decades ago, families packed picnic baskets and brought blankets on Sunday afternoons to visit and remember their ancestors. It is truly a unique setting, and a hidden treasure within Columbus.



Those who run and walk during our Kiwanis Charity 5K will have the opportunity to learn many facts about this historic park and about many of the famous people resting there. As a member of our Club, here's what you can be doing:

- 1- If you are a runner or walker, sign up to participate. Registrations are now open. You can register on line at our dedicated race website [www.Columbuscharity5k.org](http://www.Columbuscharity5k.org).
- 2- Get some additional discounts if you register a team. Talk to your friends, co-workers and family members and encourage them to enter the race under a team name, to receive an additional discount on the entry fee.
- 3- Spread the word to those you know who are runners and walkers – family members, neighbors, co-workers, etc. We all know people who are avid runners or walkers, and most are happy to enter once they are asked. But it starts with “the ask.”
