

North High Brewing

A Columbus native, Gavin Meyers received an undergraduate degree in economics from The Ohio State University. After five years in retail banking and a several-year career in the online marketing space - culminating as internet marketing manager for Stanley Steemer International - Gavin returned to Ohio State and earned his MBA at the Fisher College of Business.

Upon graduating in May 2011, Gavin left the corporate world and co-founded North High Brewing with a fellow MBA classmate, Tim Ward. Together, they recognized an opportunity to bring a new kind of brewery to Columbus: one that focuses on the EXPERIENCE of brewing. So in 2011, North High Brewing was born as Columbus' first and only 'brew on premises' establishment, where the customer is the brew master. In addition to customers brewing their own beer, North High Brewing creates small-batch, high-quality craft beer that they serve in their taproom as well as on tap at dozens of area restaurants and bars.

The demand for their beer has been so high that they recently underwent a brewery expansion that has taken them from being one of the smallest breweries in Columbus to being one of the largest. Today, North High Brewing is a top-five brewery in Central Ohio with statewide distribution, a retail taproom, and two more retail locations set to open in 2018. They were also a proud sponsor and promoter of our very successful 'Coolest Dog in Columbus' contest.

Gavin lives in Clintonville with his wife Sarah, three- and one-year old sons Grayson and Barrett, and a golden retriever known affectionately as Marley Bear.
