

Joseph Nardone is the president & chief executive officer of the Columbus Regional Airport Authority which operates John Glenn International, Rickenbacker International and Bolton Field airports in Columbus, Ohio.

As president & CEO, Joe oversees the strategic operation and management CRAA’s three airports, and is tasked with advancing air service development and creating strong partnerships to benefit the Columbus Region.

Joe most recently served as CEO of Wayne County Airport Authority, an independent governmental entity that manages and operates Detroit Metropolitan Wayne County Airport and Willow Run Airport, Michigan’s busiest airport system and one of the world’s leading air transportation hubs.

With executive experience in the public, private and nonprofit sectors, Joe also served as vice president of business development & real estate for WCAA. In that role, he was responsible for leading the real estate, concessions and air service development departments as well as handling permits, managing economic development activities and cultivating relationships with airline representatives and other tenants. He joined WCAA in 2012 as director of development.

Other notable highlights of Joe’s career include working in Europe and the U.S. while vice president of Huron Valley Steel Corporation and Fritz Enterprises; serving as Director of Southgate Properties, a nonprofit with multi-million dollar real estate transactions; and working as the economic development director for the city of Taylor, Michigan.

Libations on the Lawn will take place on Thursday evening, August 16, in the Park Plaza, located on the east side of the Columbus Metropolitan Library, just west of the Topiary Park. The event will begin at 4:30 p.m., and the Regatta competition will begin at 5:30 p.m.

We are in the process of signing up competitors. Information is available regarding the different participation/sponsorship levels your company, your civic association, your golf buddies, your family or even you as an individual can sign up for. Each competing racer will receive a wooden yacht to decorate, along with food and drink tickets, the number depending on their level of participation.

The event is open to the public, and we encourage participating groups to bring out their co-workers and friends to help cheer for their yachts. Finger foods will be provided by Freedom Ala Carte, and beer will be served from North High Brewing. Spectator tickets are \$35 each.

Proceeds from this event go to our **Columbus Kiwanis Foundation**, to help support our extensive scholarship and community grant program. One of the major beneficiaries of the Regatta continues to be the annual 'Summer Reading Challenge' conducted by the Columbus Metropolitan Library. The award-winning program helps children retain their reading skills over the summer months. Over the history of the Regatta, Kiwanis has provided more than \$250,000 to this program, and has impacted more than 1.2 million children. The annual event is always a large success, due in part to the tremendous support given to us by the Columbus Metropolitan Library. We could not do it without them.
