**Ohio Secretary of State  
Candidate – Lt. Governor**

Jon Husted currently serves as Ohio’s secretary of state, and is a conservative Republican candidate for lieutenant governor of Ohio.

He describes himself as a Christian, an American, a conservative and a Republican – in that order. Elected secretary of state in 2010, Jon was re-elected in 2014 by a margin of 24 points and won 86 of Ohio’s 88 counties.

Prior to beginning in public service, Jon worked with the Dayton-Area Chamber of Commerce and served as its vice president for economic development. He was later elected to the Ohio House of Representatives, where his Republican colleagues twice selected him to serve as Speaker of the House.

The oldest of three children, Jon was raised in Northwest Ohio’s Williams County. He graduated from Montpelier High School and earned both his bachelor’s and master’s degrees from the University of Dayton (UD). While at UD, Jon was an All-American defensive back for the Dayton Flyers and a member of the 1989 Division III national championship football team.

Jon was named the 2017 Americans for Prosperity Torchbearer for his proven fiscal conservatism after announcing he would run the secretary of state’s office without using taxpayer dollars for the remainder of his term. He was named one of the nation’s top-ten rising stars in 2013 by the Washington Post’s blog, The Fix. He has been honored nationally by the

## 2018 Kiwanis Charity Regatta prepares to launch a new format ...

When something has been working well for almost 20 years, how would you go about improving it? Easy -- you turn our famous **Kiwanis Charity Regatta** into a cocktail reception (**Libations on the Lawn**), to celebrate our **20th** anniversary of this event. The new format will provide a more relaxed atmosphere, so business and civic leaders can network, socialize and relax before heading home.



**Libations on the Lawn** will take place on Thursday evening, August 16, in the Park Plaza, located on the east side of the Columbus Metropolitan Library, just west of the Topiary Park. The event will begin at 4:30 p.m., and the Regatta competition will begin at 5:30 p.m.

We are in the process of signing up competitors. Information is available regarding the different participation/sponsorship levels your company, your civic association, your golf buddies, your family or even you as an individual can sign up for. Each competing racer will receive a wooden yacht to decorate, along with food and drink tickets, the number depending on their level of participation.

The event is open to the public, and we encourage participating groups to bring out their co-workers and friends to help cheer for their yachts. Finger foods will be provided by Freedom Ala Carte, and beer will be served from North High Brewing. Spectator tickets are \$35 each.

Proceeds from this event go to our **Columbus Kiwanis Foundation**, to help support our extensive scholarship and community grant program. One of the major beneficiaries of the Regatta continues to be the annual 'Summer Reading Challenge' conducted by the Columbus Metropolitan Library. The award-winning program helps children retain their reading skills over the summer months. Over the history of the Regatta, Kiwanis has provided more than \$250,000 to this program, and has impacted more than 1.2 million children. The annual event is always a large success, due in part to the tremendous support given to us by the Columbus Metropolitan Library. We could not do it without them.

## Membership – a five-step process ...

The following five-step approach to inviting a new person to join Kiwanis is paraphrased from the Club President's Education, Eye of the Tiger documents for the 2017-18 administrative year. The materials were written by KI President, Jim Rochford, and his advisors and they can be very effective in recruiting new members to our Club. Why "reinvent the wheel," when you have this information available? Some ideas were changed to specifically address inviting a prospective member to an existing club.

**1. Approach:** At first, talk about anything except Kiwanis. Try to find out what the person is interested in, if you don't already know.

**2. Qualify:** Ask what the person knows about Kiwanis. If the person has some knowledge, ask him/her to elaborate, focusing on the person's positive experience. Ask questions about his/her interest in children, the community and family. Perhaps the person might have a special talent or interest he/she would enjoy sharing with children.

**3. Programs:** When the connection is made, begin to explain the Kiwanis programs like K-Kids, Builders Clubs or Key Club, or talk about what our Club is doing in the community. You are now demonstrating the mission, focus and goals of Kiwanis.

**4. Trial Close:** Ask the person if he/she would like to attend a meeting of the world's greatest organization for helping young people. Continue with specific information about where and when our Club meets.

**5. Close:** Offer to email, text or call the person to remind them of the meeting. You may also offer to drive them to the meeting, if that is possible. Close with "Our Kiwanis Club needs people like you." Or "Won't you consider joining us in helping children of our community?"

**6. Don't give up:** If the first invitation ends with a non-committal response, call the person to invite them to a service project or a fund-raising event. Sometimes, prospective members enjoy interacting with members during an event that highlights what we are doing in the community, in addition to the fun and fellowship that goes along with Club membership.
