Cory Dippold became the executive director for Ohio Business Week Foundation in March of 2018; however, he has been in the non-profit field for more than 20 years, as both a volunteer and as a professional.

Ohio Business Week (OBW) has partnered with Kiwanis Club of Columbus for many years to help conduct our annual Entrepreneurial Challenge, a mini-version of their full program. OBW is the only week-long, residential business and entrepreneurship camp in Ohio. It is attended by high school students who have an interest in business, entrepreneurship or just want to experience college and explore different careers. Students who attend are divided into companies. Each company is led by a business professional, who mentors the students throughout the week as they develop a unique service or product idea to solve a real-world business problem. Consultants and speakers from various businesses and industries will visit with the students, discussing important topics that help them craft their business, financial and marketing plans which will bring their idea to market. The program culminates in a presentation to business executives at the end of the week, when students pitch their ideas to prospective investors.

Cory has been a volunteer with the HOBY Youth Leadership organization since 2000, serving as a group facilitator, chairing seven local seminars and chairing the World Leadership Congress in 2011, the latter with more than 400 participants from 14 countries. He worked for 10 years for Leadership Toledo where he served as youth director and
