

ANIL K. MAKHIJA

Fisher College of Business



Anil K. Makhija serves as dean and John W. Berry, Sr. Chair in Business of The Ohio State University Fisher College of Business. Makhija is recognized as an expert in the field of finance, particularly capital structure, corporate governance and valuation, and has more than 20 years of experience in academic leadership roles.

Prior to his appointment to dean in October 2014, Makhija served as senior associate dean at Fisher. He has served on the faculty of the business college since 1998 and has held the Dean's Distinguished Professorship and the David A. Rismiller Professorship in Finance. He chaired Fisher's Department of Finance and served as an associate dean of executive education programs, where he was responsible for the development of Fisher's top-ranked Executive MBA program. He also played a key leadership role in the development of the GE Capital-funded National Center for the Middle Market, serving as the center's academic director.

Makhija previously served as associate dean at the University of Pittsburgh's Katz Graduate School of Business, where was on the business faculty for more than 15 years. In addition, he has had short visiting faculty appointments at respected institutions in Korea, Hong Kong, India, the Czech Republic, Ecuador, and Chile.

Makhija is a widely published and highly respected researcher as well as the winner of numerous teaching awards, including the Alumni Award for Distinguished Teaching and the Pace Setters Daniel Westerbeck Teaching Excellence Award — the highest teaching honors bestowed by, respectively, Ohio State and Fisher College of Business. ## 1916: The Link between ukuleles and Kiwanis Club of Columbus? Really?

As we prepare for our Club’s Centennial Celebration (May 7), you may wonder what ukuleles have to do with anything.

Well, there’s of course our own Kiwanis Club of Columbus Mighty Ukulele Orchestra and its melodic notes. What you may not know is that one of what became the premier ukuleles of all time was initially handmade by Samuel Kamaka in his basement in Kaimuki, Hawaii. In 1916, he named his shop the Kamaka Ukulele and Guitar Works, producing high quality ukuleles.

**Female Kiwanians:** Women became “Official” members of Kiwanis International at the 1987 convention in Washington, D.C. The issue had been debated for many years, with some clubs allowing women frequently to join at the local levels before the ’87 vote. Our Club has had five female Presidents:

**Father/Son Presidents:** There have been 102 Presidents of The Kiwanis Club of Columbus, including two fathers/sons who served as President.

- 1971: **David L. Fenner** and
- 1999: **David T. Fenner**
- 1972: **William Coons** and
- 1986: **Theodore W. Coons**

There is an interesting coincidence within our history. When William Coons died shortly after his Presidency began, in 1972, he was succeeded by Jack W. Miller. More than 10 years later, following the untimely death of Dr. Frederick Bunte, again shortly after he assumed the Presidency in 1987, it was Theodore W. Coons (son of William) who stepped in to serve as President.

## Foundation trustees to elect trustees and officers ...

Trustees and members of Columbus Kiwanis Foundation will meet on Monday, January 25, at 1 p.m., immediately following the regularly scheduled Kiwanis Club meeting.

In addition to normal business that will include a review of the financial status of the Foundation, the attendees will receive the report of the nominating committee.

There are two individuals whose terms expire but who are eligible for re-election, if they decide to run. One additional position is open due to a resignation.

All members of the Club are members of the Foundation and are eligible to vote.

## Attendance tracking ...

Attendance credits are earned throughout the year by attending Monday meetings, participating in committee meetings, attending Trustee meetings, going to interclubs, serving as a greeter or invocator, participating in a community service project and so on. To earn "Perfect Attendance" for the administrative year, you must earn at least 48 attendance credits – the equivalent of one credit per week for each of the weeks when we have Monday Club meetings.
