John C. (Jack) Fisher has served since 1996 as the executive vice president of the Ohio Farm Bureau Federation, Ohio's largest general farm organization, with more than 201,000 members.

Fisher grew up on a farm in Crawford County, Ohio. He holds bachelor's and master's degrees in agriculture from The Ohio State University, and a master's degree in counseling from Ball State University. He served as personnel officer for the U.S. Air Force Tactical Fighter Wing located in Lakenheath, England, from 1969 to 1973.

Jack has extensive experience in both government and agribusiness. He was deputy director of the Ohio Department of Agriculture from 1980 to 1983, after serving as assistant to the director from 1973 to 1976. He has also held the position of director of the Illinois Corn Growers Association and Marketing Board, was executive director of governmental affairs and commodities for the Illinois Farm Bureau, and earlier was plant manager for the popcorn division of Wyandot, Inc., in Morral, Ohio.

Fisher is a former member of the board of trustees at The Ohio State University, and currently serves as a member of the vice president's advisory council for The Ohio State University College of Food, Agricultural and Environmental Sciences. He has been inducted into the OSU Department of Animal Science Hall of Fame and was awarded the OSU College of Food, Agricultural and Environmental Sciences Distinguished Service Award and the Meritorious Service to Students

The team was headed by **Jim Shively** and included **Neil Distelhorst, Jim Skidmore, Caitlyn Nestleroth, JJ Johnson, David Brainin, Bob Barnes** and **Tom Demko**.

Throughout 2015, Furniture Bank of Columbus served 3,774 families including 10,834 individuals, 5,549 of which were children. Through 19,051 volunteer hours, they provided 58,320 pieces of furniture to families in need.

Award. Fisher also holds the FFA Honorary State Farmer Degree, and was recognized with a national FFA Honorary American Farmer Degree in October 2005.

Additionally, he participates in the Farm Foundation Round Table and Dialogue on Food and Agriculture in the 21st Century initiative. Fisher serves on the board of trustees for BioOhio and Columbus 2020 Economic Development Board. He also is co-chair of the OSU College of Food, Agricultural and Environmental Sciences Fundraising Campaign Planning and Fundraising Organization. He has served as a member of The Ohio State University Alumni Association Board of Directors; Ohio Farmland Preservation Task Force; Advisory Committee for the Swank Chair in Rural Urban Policy at The Ohio State University; and the Board of Directors for Children's Hunger Alliance. Over the years, Jack has participated in several international trade missions with both government and commodity interests.

He is married to the former Judy Cook of Wooster, Ohio. The Fishers have three children and seven grandchildren, and reside in Columbus.



We continue to take a look back at our Club members when they were young and innocent. Well, maybe the latter is an assumption, but there's no question these photos are of their youth.





New approach for reading program ...
