Scott Humphrys is an entrepreneur and seasoned leader with a diverse background of military service, Fortune Top 50 experience and small business start-up. He is an owner of Mission Essential Personnel, an Ohio-headquartered company producing \$400 million in revenue, with 4,000 employees worldwide. Mr. Humphrys recently founded BackScatter Solutions, an Advising firm focused on helping business leaders plan and execute strategic growth. When not engaged in company matters, Scott is deeply involved at The Wellington School as a committee member, guest lecturer, and mentor.

Prior to starting Mission Essential Personnel, Scott enjoyed a successful career as an officer and aviator in the US Army, serving multiple tours overseas and retiring as a lieutenant colonel. He was a purchasing manager at Proctor & Gamble, managing \$125 million in chemical raw materials for their Fabric & Homecare division. Mr. Humphrys left P&G to move to Columbus and accept a leadership position with the Ohio Army National Guard. While with the Army National Guard, he and his partners began Mission Essential Personnel and two years later was awarded Ernst & Young’s “Entrepreneur of the Year” for emerging businesses in 2006.

Scott continues to seek opportunities to positively impact growing organizations, support the development of young people and to help students pursue their passions and embrace their unique qualities. He earned his bachelor’s degree from The University of Massachusetts in Environmental Health and will receive his MBA from the Fisher College of Business at The Ohio State University in May. Scott lives in Upper Arlington with his wife and two children.
