Cheryl Turnbull assumed the role of senior director, finance and venture capital within the Ohio State University's Technology Commercialization Office in January 2013. She is responsible for oversight of the \$100 million investment in the university's economic development funds. Cheryl has helped establish a continuum of six funds from pre-seed to seed-plus stages to develop and mature university technologies from concepts to companies. She serves on the investment committees of several funds and as principal liaison to Rev1 Ventures, the Central Ohio business incubator.

Cheryl provides effective leadership and coordination for the fiscal and long-range financial planning of start-up businesses in her role as the New Ventures Team Lead, and the establishment of their major financial objectives and policies. She is also responsible for the measurement and effectiveness of processes through the establishment of operational controls, administrative and reporting procedures, and key performance indicators.

Cheryl was a founding partner (2009-2012) of Capital Transactions, LLC, a corporate advisory firm. There, she worked with privately owned businesses and not-for-profits to establish the strategic, operational, financial and informational infrastructure to enable the organizations to succeed and expand.

A graduate of Miami University, Cheryl earned her bachelor's degree in finance and economics before going on to the J.L. Kellogg Graduate school of Management (at Northwestern University), where she earned her master's in management, with distinction. She currently serves on the Women's Board of the Community Shelter Board and on the finance committee of the Catholic Diocese of Columbus.


