## Be patriotic ...

Nothing tells your friends and neighbors of your patriotism like flying the American flag on each of the five major Federal holidays. But how many of us remember to get the flag out on those important days when we often are busy with family and community events that divert our attention?

What if for one small fee, you could have a service set up a temporary flag and flag pole in your yard for each of the five holidays, beginning with Memorial Day this May? No work on your part and you never have to worry about remembering. Heck, you don't even have to be home!

Well, you can, if you sign up and pay for the service by Friday, May 14. This is a fund-raising/community service project being coordinated by the Hilltop Kiwanis Club. They will bring an American flag on a 10' flag pole and erect it in your yard or at your place of business. They will bring it five times per year on each of the five major flag holidays, and place it in a 12" piece of PVC tubing which will be capped when not in use. They will bring it a few days before the holiday and take it down a few days following the holiday. The cost of this service is only \$30 per year – that's \$6 per holiday!!!
