The field of competitors is just about set, and the day will undoubtedly be filled with fun, laughter and competitive, yet friendly, spirit.

There are three things you can do ... and each is vitally important to the success of this event:

1- Be sure to attend. If you show up at the Athletic Club for lunch that Monday, you may be eating alone. The Library is only a few blocks away and you can park for free in their parking garage (*be sure to bring your ticket to the event to get validated*). Lunch tickets are only \$5 per person and you will get plenty to eat, plus an attendance credit.

2- Sell lunch tickets. Having a big crowd adds to the fun and the excitement and so we need your help selling tickets to friends, family members and co-workers. You can buy some in advance to hand out to those you think might be interested, or you can take some out on consignment, being sure you return either \$5 per ticket and/or any unsold tickets. There is a prize for the member who sells the most.

Lunch tickets purchased will be placed into a drawing for some door prizes, so even if someone you know does not plan to attend, they may be willing to make a contribution and have their ticket entered into the drawing for the door prizes.

3- Secure on-line donations – We are raising money for the Columbus Kiwanis Foundation, a 501(c)3 tax-deductible organization. Funds raised from the event will be placed right back into the community dollar-for-dollar to help shelter the homeless, feed the hungry, mentor the disadvantaged and care for the sick. ## Golf tournament volunteers needed...

**Kiwanis Club of Columbus** has agreed to staff the drink concession tent at tee #4 during the week of The Presidents Cup, to be held October 1 through 6, at Muirfield Village Golf Club. Eight percent of all sales will be divided proportionately among the volunteer groups that work that week. The proceeds we receive will be put toward the 1916 Society and our goal to raise an incremental \$100,000 to be awarded in grants during our centennial year in 2016.

The Presidents Cup competition consists of 34 matches -- 11 foursomes (alternate shot), 11 four-ball (better ball) matches and 12 singles matches involving all players on the final Sunday. All matches are worth one point each, for a total of 34 points.

Foursome and four-ball matches tied at the end of 18 holes are halved, with each side receiving 1/2 point. Singles matches tied after 18 holes will go extra holes until a match winner is determined. The winning team will have to accumulate no less than 17.5 points to win The Presidents Cup. In a change inspired by the events of The Presidents Cup 2003, if the match is deadlocked at the end of singles play, the competition will be deemed a tie and the teams will share The Presidents Cup.

Those who volunteer will receive a pass to that day's play, a parking permit and a free lunch. Shifts vary, and assuming we have ample people, there will be time for breaks to watch the play. Here are the shifts we need to fill:

- October 1 – 3 people, 8 a.m. to 3 p.m., and  
3 people, 11 a.m. to close
- October 2 – 3 people, 8 a.m. to 3 p.m., and  
3 people, 11 a.m. to close
- October 3 – 8 people, 9:30 a.m. to close
- October 4 – 8 people, 9:30 a.m. to close
- October 5 – 4 people, 8 a.m. to 3 p.m., and  
4 people, 11 a.m. to close
- October 6 – 8 people, 9 a.m. to close.

If you would like to volunteer for one or more of these shifts, please contact Secretary **Paul Bohlman**. You can volunteer for more than one shift if you would like and you are welcome to bring a guest (spouse, co-worker, etc.) to work with you. We will fill the slots on a first-come, first-served basis, so please respond early.
