

## Kiwanis Corporate Regatta

The concept is simple! Each "skipper" gets to race his/her sailboat across a pool of water using a 'Super-soaker' squirt gun as the means of propulsion. Three boats are raced in each heat and the winner goes on to the winner's bracket. It is a double-elimination process, so all entrants are guaranteed at least two races. The winner receives a check for \$1,000, made payable to the charity of their choice.

Lunch will be served beginning at 11:45 a.m., at a cost of \$5 per person. Lunch tickets can be purchased at the event, which is open to the general public. In fact, the more people we have cheering on the participants, the more fun we have. So don't hesitate to bring along your office staff, family members and friends. Kids will enjoy seeing the mascots from the Columbus Blue Jackets and the Columbus Clippers. Club members should be sure to check in to make sure you are given an attendance credit.

The racing will begin at approximately noon and will go until the winner is determined. The event will happen, rain or shine. Past President **Dan McCormick** will again serve as our emcee, along with Amy Lutz, Fox 28 TV 'Good Day, Columbus' anchor.
