

Wayne Moore is a leadership development coach in Columbus, where he takes a distinctly different tack in the effort to help individuals become more effective and to help organizations improve morale and become more efficient. Wayne advocates being more present in our everyday tasks and more authentic in our relationships (business and personal) in order to lead a more effective, less stressful life and to create success in our businesses.

He teaches classes as diverse as: Parenting Teens; Stress Management; Living in the Here and Now; Public Servants Who Love to Come to Work; What Great Managers Do; The Art of Listening; Assertive Communication; Anger Management; and Why Your Workgroup Needs Healthy Conflict.

‘Shred-It’ Day scheduled for fall ...

Twice each year, we team up with WCMH-TV4 to assist with their ‘Shred-It’ Day program. The next one is scheduled for Saturday, September 20.

WCMH-TV4 ‘Shred-It’ Day provides an opportunity for citizens to have a safe and secure method for destroying sensitive documents, such as bank statements, tax returns and credit card information. The Shred-It Company provides 8-10 trucks, to shred the documents on site. Our job, as volunteers, is to help more than 3,000 vehicles as they each pull up to unload their documents.



We will again be providing 15 or more people to fill each of three shifts beginning at 6:45 a.m., 9 a.m. and 11:30 a.m., respectively. The event will be held at the Ohio Expo Center, just off I-71.

No experience is necessary, just a willingness to work hard for a few hours. It is a great opportunity for Scout troops, teenaged children and spouses to experience a Kiwanis service project, so feel free to invite them. The more hands we have, the easier the work becomes.

The **Manna Café** is part of the ministry of Broad Street United Methodist Church. Each week, they serve a hot dinner to approximately 175-200 adults. Once each quarter, Kiwanis Club of Columbus, through a grant from the Columbus Kiwanis Foundation, purchases the food, prepares it and serves it. Our next evening for this project is scheduled for Wednesday, September 24. Recently, we were saddened by the loss of long-time member and Past President **George R. Manser**. George was not a typical member. He was a leader, a motivator and a role model for many who joined Kiwanis, as well as the many other organizations he was involved with throughout his career.

George was the inspiration behind the creation of the 1916 Society within our Columbus Kiwanis Foundation, and helped launch the concept with an extremely generous matching gift challenge. Just last year, Kiwanis Club of Columbus created the George R. Manser Humanitarian Award to recognize an outstanding Columbus citizen who models the same civic-minded characteristics possessed by George. This award will be presented for the first time during our centennial year in 2016.

James Howard: a special need, a special request ...

Many of us remember **James Howard** from Kiwanis Club of Hilliard, who served as Division 10-W Lt. Governor about six years ago (2008-09 Administrative year).

James is about 47 years old and was in a horrific car accident two months ago. He was in ICU at Riverside for an extended period and is now in a long-term rehabilitation facility. He has lost the use of his legs, his kidneys have failed and he is not a transplant candidate. He is fighting for survival, and it is not looking good.

To compound the situation, his wife has Parkinson’s disease. Due to all of the medical expenses from James, she has left the nursing home she was in and is now living with their oldest daughter. Their daughter has a 3-month old baby to care for, as well, and she also looks after her younger sister, who, coincidentally, is in Key Club.

The family is in dire need and we would like to help them in some way. The Hilliard Club has taken the lead on several projects but the financial needs are great.

Beginning this week, we will be ‘passing the proverbial hat,’ asking for donations that will go to the family. You can either throw in some cash or write a check (*checks should be made out to Kiwanis Club of Columbus*) and give it to Club Secretary **Paul Bohlman**. As news become available, we will keep you posted on James’ progress. In the meantime, please keep him in your prayers and let’s join together to help his family through this very difficult time.

35th annual Columbus Kiwanis College Fair taking shape ...

The 35th Annual Columbus Kiwanis College Fair is scheduled for Monday, September 29, at the Aladdin Shrine Temple, located on Stelzer Road near Easton Town Center.



Colleges and universities from more than 25 states will be sending representatives to set up information tables and to interact with area high school students. The first session will run from 9 a.m. to noon, and will accommodate those schools wishing to bring students and guidance counselors via bus. The evening session (6 p.m. to 8 p.m.) will allow parents to attend, help gather information and attend brief seminars on college finances and how to make the most of a campus visit.

We are in need of 12-15 volunteers for the morning program and another 6 to 8 for the evening program. There will be two volunteer shifts in the morning, 7:30 a.m. to 10 a.m., and 10 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. The morning shift will help check in college and university representatives by assisting them with their materials and directing them to their assigned booths. Once this is done, and the students begin arriving, the volunteers will help distribute materials to each student who attends. The second shift and evening shift will also be distributing materials to the students.
