Good News travels

Saturday, October 22, 19 Kiwanians teamed up with 13 members of the Boys & Girls Club Key Club, four members of the Capital University Circle K Club and 22 members of Delta Chi Fraternity to lend a helping hand with the bi-annual "Shred-it" Day conducted by WCMH TV-4 and Shred It. More than 60 other volunteers from various companies and organizations were also on hand to make it all work. During the six-hour event, 4,830 cars passed through, dropping off a wide variety of personal documents to be shredded and recycled. More than 115 tons (230,000 pounds) of paper was shredded, an amount equal to 1,150 trees. In addition, television personalities collected more than \$7,220 in donations for Nationwide Children's Hospital. "Shred-it" Day is held each spring and fall to allow for the safe destruction of documents which could, if not properly destroyed, lead to identity theft. One result of the day was **Kiwanian Jim Skidmore had the opportunity to mention the Kiwanis Club of Columbus during an interview that aired on both the 6 p.m. and 11 p.m. tv4 news. Way to go!**

1st Lady's Project

As we are getting ready for the official visit from our Gov and First Lady let's look at our 1st Lady's Project "Project Backpack" will ease the trauma of children who are removed from their homes and placed in foster or relative care in every county in Ohio. We're going to need about \$18,000 to purchase backpacks for 12,000 kids for one year. Since this is a two-part project, I understand that many clubs have chosen to cut back on monetary donations in order to donate items to put into the backpacks. I appreciate that you are thinking about covering both parts, and I encourage all clubs to keep this project at the top of your "importance" list. ³⁵₁₇The Third Prize \$150 for ELIMINATE Project

Here's how you win:

For those clubs that have a NET gain in membership as of 8/31/12, compared to 10/31/11,

³⁵₁₇First Prize – awarded to clubs that have a 20 % increase in membership, with a min. net gain of five. Clubs of 100+ can achieve this with a net gain of 20.

If a new club is built, the prize will be awarded to BOTH the sponsoring club and the new club.

³⁵₁₇Second Prize – awarded to clubs that have a 15 % net increase in membership, with a min. net gain of four. Clubs of 100+members can achieve this with a net gain of 15.

³⁵₁₇Third Prize – awarded to clubs that have a 10% net increase in membership, with a min. net gain of 3. Clubs of 100 + can achieve this with a net gain of 10.

Here are the rules:

³⁵₁₇The official KI membership figures for October 31, 2011 and August 31, 2012 are the basis for awards.

³⁵₁₇To receive credit for building a new Kiwanis Club, the applications and fees must be submitted to KI, the charter approved by KI and the date for the organization meeting set by August 31.

³⁵₁₇Payments will be made by the District office to KI in support of the ELIMINATE Project, to be credited to the club winning the award.

³⁵₁₇The District has allocated a maximum of \$1,800 in each prize category. In the event more clubs qualify than funds are available, the funds will be equally divided within each of the categories.

³⁵₁₇Winning clubs will be notified by 9/15/12.
