A leading figure in central Ohio's business, civic and public service community, Mr. Worley is a seasoned professional with more than 20 years of responsible leadership, management and financial experience.

Since January 2007, Mr. Worley has served as President/Chief Executive Officer of Columbus Downtown Development Corporation (CDDC) and Capitol South Community Urban Redevelopment Corporation. In that role, Mr. Worley is focused on the redevelopment and revitalization of Downtown Columbus. Some of his accomplishments include redevelopment of the Lazarus Building into 700,000 square foot of office space; the redevelopment of the former City Center site now known as Columbus Commons; and the redevelopment of Columbus' riverfront into the Scioto Mile, both of which are recognized as prominent new urban parks.

Previously, Mr. Worley served as Chief of Staff for Columbus Mayor Michael B. Coleman. He was an executive consultant in performance management and budgeting with CGI-AMS' Advantage ERP service line in Fairfax, Virginia. Prior to that, Mr. Worley served as County Administrator for the Franklin County Board of Commissioners in Columbus. As the Chief Executive Officer for the 33rd largest county in the United States, Mr. Worley was responsible for the administration, planning, budgeting and staffing of the County Commissioners' organization.

Mr. Worley currently is an instructor of Performance Management and Budgeting at The Ohio State University John Glenn School of Public Affairs. He earned his bachelor's degree in economics and master's degree in public administration at The Ohio State University.
