

Edward Pauline serves as the director of the Buckeye Leadership Fellows Program (BLF). In this role, Edward leads the daily operations of the program, which include the design and creation of the curriculum, instructing and mentoring students and outreach and engagement.

As director, Edward works with a board of advisors to secure private financial support for the program. Along with his responsibilities in BLF, Edward serves as a trustee for Leadership Columbus, as an advisor to the Mabel G. Freeman Chapter of Mortar Board Senior Class Honor Society and is a member of the Board of Control for the Ohio State University Faculty Club. He is a graduate of Leadership Columbus, is active in the Columbus Metropolitan Club and is also a member of the Columbus Rotary.

Prior to coming to Ohio State, Edward worked in the digital media industry for startups and large media corporations primarily in Seattle and New York, where he was part of the team that led the successful acquisition of Scout.com to Fox Interactive Media (now Fox Digital). He held positions at FoxSports.com, Fantasy Sports Ventures (acquired by USA Today) and ASmallWorld.com, where he was director of North American sales.

Edward holds two bachelor's degrees from The Ohio State University, where he served as student government president for two consecutive terms. He has an MBA in finance from Franklin University. Edward has been a member of the Ohio State staff since 2010.

“Shred-It” day ...

The annual spring “Shred-It” day, coordinated by WCMH-TV4, is scheduled for Saturday, May 2, at the parking lots at Crew Stadium. The event will run from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m., and Kiwanis Club of Columbus will again play a major role in staffing the effort. Since the first NBC-4 “Shred-It” day (2003), 2,128 tons of personal documents have been shredded and recycled, and \$96,170 has been raised for Nationwide Children’s Hospital.

We need to provide 15 or more volunteers for each of three shifts: 7:30 a.m. to 10 a.m.; 10 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. and 12:30 p.m. to 3 p.m. Snacks and lunch will be provided. Family members, co-workers, neighbors and friends are welcome to join us. Most of the duties will involve unloading boxes and bags from the trunks of cars (lifting) and carrying them over to the Shred-It trucks. Other light duties are available directing traffic.

Did you know that 3 billion people cannot afford shoes, and in the United States alone, approximately 630 million pairs of shoes are thrown away each year?



The materials used to manufacture a pair of shoes are created from chemical compounds, the kind that will create health hazards if left to disintegrate openly or in landfills. By donating your shoes to the Shoes for H.O.P.E. (Helping Other People Excel) program, what would have gone into landfills will be given a second chance to make a difference.

Your generous donation of new or used shoes can make a difference in the lives of people everywhere, and can possibly save lives. People die every day from diseases contracted from not having shoes to wear. Shoes can be used to prevent hardship and life-threatening symptoms caused by parasitic infection and soil-transmitted diseases. Approximately two billion people worldwide suffer with parasitic diseases that can be prevented by wearing shoes.

Help Kiwanis Club of Columbus support the Ohio District campaign to collect 250 pair of used shoes from every club in the District. Shoes of any shape, style, size and condition are needed. Take a look in your closet – way in the back, buried under something else – yep, there they are, those shoes that haven't been worn in five years. Those are the ones we want. You won't miss them. Just get them to Club Secretary **Paul Bohlman** and he will get them to the District for the campaign.
