

Candidates Day Kiwanis Trustees

Jack D'Aurora is a business lawyer with The Behal Law Group and a contributor to *The Columbus Dispatch* op-ed and *Columbus Business First* viewpoint sections.


A native of Steubenville, Ohio, Jack graduated from Notre Dame and was commissioned in the U.S. Navy in 1977. He received his Naval Flight Officer wings in 1978 and was assigned to an F-14 squadron in San Diego in 1979. During two western Pacific deployments, he logged more than 300 carrier-arrested landings aboard the USS Kitty Hawk.

After graduating from Georgetown Law Center in 1987, Jack returned to San Diego, where he practiced law and flew with Naval Reserve F-14 squadrons. He has been practicing in Columbus since 1991.

Jack joined Kiwanis in 2009. He has helped with the Boys and Girls Club reading program, served as a trustee in 2012 and is a member of the Homeless committee. Jack chaired the YCPO committee last year and now chairs the Program committee.

Jack's wife, Debbie, is a nurse executive, and they have four adult children.

David Kandel is delighted to run and serve as trustee of the Kiwanis Club of Columbus. David joined the Club in 2000 and has been an active member, especially in the Music & Arts and Program committees. David had been committee chair and co-chair of the Music & Arts committee, and he sings Lead tenor in the Kiwanis quartet known throughout the western hemisphere as *What The Heck Four*. This quartet, which also includes Larry Icenogle, Paul Baumer and Bob Eberhart, has raised thousands of dollars for the Club through their annual Singing Valentines program. David retired from AT&T as director of external affairs the end of last year, following a 34-year corporate career, which has freed up his time to serve as trustee. David's campaign manager is "Lorenzo the Liquidator," and team members include "Paulie the Pulverizer" and "Roberto the Rectifier."




JP LaFramboise joined Kiwanis in March of 2013 and he enjoys being an active member with the organization.

The five candidates elected in May of 2015 will serve their first term with these candidates and their second term with the candidates elected in 2016.*

Helpful hints ...

Goodbye, fruit flies! To get rid of pesky fruit flies, take a small glass, fill it half-full with Apple Cider Vinegar and 2 drops of dishwashing liquid; mix well. You will find those flies drawn to the cup, and then gone forever!



Re-heat Pizza - Heat up leftover pizza in a nonstick skillet on top of the stove, set the heat to medium-low and heat until warm. This keeps the crust crispy. No need to eat soggy micro-waved pizza anymore.

Easy deviled eggs - Put cooked egg yolks in a Ziplock bag, seal it, then mash the yolks until they are all broken up. Add the rest of the ingredients, re-seal the bag, keep mashing up the mix thoroughly, and then cut the tip of the Ziplock and squeeze the mixture into the firm egg whites. Just throw the bag away; it's an easy clean-up.
