

DR. JOHN CAMPO

Ohio State University College of Medicine Department of Psychiatry



Dr. John Campo, MD, a nationally recognized expert in child and adolescent psychiatry, was named chair of the College of Medicine's Department of Psychiatry in 2012.

Dr. Campo has been at Ohio State since 2006, and is the former director of the Division of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry and medical director of Pediatric Behavioral Health, a joint position serving Nationwide Children's Hospital and Ohio State. He served as interim chair of Ohio State's Department of Psychiatry in 2011. Dr. Campo is also director of Psychiatry at Ohio State's Wexner Medical Center and professor of Clinical Psychiatry and Clinical Pediatrics.

Charles J. Lockwood, MD, former dean of Ohio State's College of Medicine, said Dr. Campo has a national reputation for developing mental health programs that deliver high-quality results. "John's demonstrated expertise as a clinician, researcher and administrator have led to many successful initiatives that have improved the mental health care of patients of all ages," says Dr. Lockwood, who made the appointment. "John is widely respected as a colleague and distinguished leader who works collaboratively with community mental health programs, private industry and government agencies to nurture a better understanding of our most challenging and vexing mental health issues."

Steven G. Gabbe, MD, CEO of the Medical Center, anticipates Dr. Campo's leadership will expand the national recognition of the Department of Psychiatry. "John has dedicated his career to improving the lives of people with mental illness, and he is committed to advancing the treatment of psychiatric conditions in children and adults," says Dr. Gabbe. "We're very excited about his new role here at Ohio State."

Dr. Campo completed medical school at the University of Pennsylvania, as well as residencies in pediatrics at Children's

## Columbus Mighty Ukulele Orchestra to perform at Capital University ...

On July 12, 2014, the Kiwanis Club of Columbus Mighty Ukulele Orchestra will present a program of music for ukuleles and voices at Capital University. The concert will begin at 8 p.m. in

The Huntington Recital Hall. The members of the ensemble performing on this program are Ron Cook, soprano and tenor ukuleles; Janice Cook, bass ukulele; Ken Keller, baritone ukulele; and Scott Lindsey, tenor ukulele.



The KCOCMUO's programs explore the incredibly wide range of music that has been performed using the humble ukulele, which has been experiencing a renaissance over the past several years. This summer, the door opens wide into Spain ...

This month, the Peart pair - comprised of London siblings Ruth and Luke Peart - will be part of Columbus Children's Choir's (CCC) 36-member touring ensemble, New World Singers, as they take part in a nine-day music tour that takes them to the Spanish cities of Barcelona, Segovia and Granada. They will present public performances at historic basilicas and churches across the country. Performances of note include a cultural exchange with the Escolania de Segovia, one of Spain's foremost children's choirs, and two engagements at Granada's prestigious International Festival of Music and Dance.



The group is led by Artistic Director Jeanne Wohlgamuth, CCC Conductor Sarah Santilli and accompanist Chad Baker. "Interacting with a culture different from their own is one of the most powerful ways children begin to understand," Wohlgamuth said. "When they can do that through music, the overall knowledge they acquire is meaningful and long-lasting. I am thrilled that CCC is able to offer its singers the chance to grow as individuals and to bond with their fellow choir members."

CCC staff, singers, and parents have been raising funds for nearly 10 months leading up to the tour. The organization received a \$10,000 grant from **Kiwanis Club of Columbus** to provide scholarships for singers with financial need, and \$5,000 from Limited Brands to support the tour. Performances at central Ohio churches, as well as bake sales and additional fundraisers have also assisted the NWS in defraying their travel costs.

Wohlgamuth has traveled abroad several times with her choirs from Dublin Jerome High School. The Columbus Children's Choir (CCC) has been reaching audiences throughout central Ohio and beyond for more than two decades-first as the Columbus Symphony Orchestra Children's Chorus, and for 18 seasons as CCC. The organization is supported by the Ohio Arts Council, the Columbus Foundation, White Castle, the Greater Columbus Arts Council, Puffin Foundation West, Limited Brands, the Ohio Alliance for Arts Education, and **Kiwanis Club of Columbus**.
