



What:

The 2014 Columbus International 5K will take place on Saturday, April 26 beginning at 9 a.m. For the more competitive runners, it will serve as a training event, and for the casual runners and walkers, it will be enjoyable exercise in a great setting. The race will have an international theme and will feature exhibits from different countries along the race course. Participants will receive an international 'tech' T-shirt as part of their entry.

Why:

To build awareness of the international community and to raise funds for the worldwide elimination of maternal and neonatal tetanus.

Where:

The race will begin and end at **Scioto Audubon Metro Park** (400 W. Whittier Street, just south of downtown Columbus along the river) and traverse in part, along the scenic Scioto-mile bike path.

Cost:

To participate, runners and walkers can register on-line through Speedy Sneakers, or the web site in this brochure. Early registration (prior to April 4) is \$30 per person, with a \$10 discount for students and groups. Late registrations and day of registrations are \$35 with a \$10 discount for students.
