Daniel B. Law

DLA Chaplain Liaison for Military & Veteran's Issues

This coming weekend is Easter and we are pleased to have Daniel B. Law, DLA Chaplain Liaison for Military & Veteran Issues, deliver a non-denominational Easter message to us this week.

Chaplain Law enlisted in the active Army as a high school senior in 1968, served as an engineer in Viet Nam from 1969 to 1970, and was discharged in 1971. He then enlisted in the Army Reserve, where he served from February 1972 through March 1974 in Company D, 2nd Battalion, 11th Special Forces Group (Airborne). From there, he transferred into the Army National Guard's Company B, 1st Battalion, 166th Infantry as an infantryman in April 1974.



In 1975, Dan entered the Ohio National Guard's Officer Candidate School program, from which he was commissioned an Air Defense Artillery lieutenant and attended the Air Defense Artillery Officer basic course in 1976. In 1978, 1-166 Infantry reorganized, dropping their ADA assets, and Dan transferred into Infantry branch as a platoon leader. In 1980, he transferred into the Individual Ready Reserve while attending seminary, and in 1986, he was ordained, returning to 1-166 as the battalion's staff chaplain.

In 1992, 1-166 deactivated and the units reactivated as 1-148 Infantry. Dan continued his duties as staff chaplain. In 1998, he transferred into the Retired Reserve due to downsizing. In September of 2006, Dan returned to the Army Reserve as a volunteer chaplain for the 718th Transportation Battalion and to provide chaplain coverage in Central Ohio area. This is the position he serves in today.

Dan is a 1978 graduate of Franklin University and holds a degree in Business Administration. Also in 1978, he graduated from Trinity Lutheran Seminary with a Master of Sacred Theology in pastoral care. He received his Master of Divinity from Methodist Theological School in 1985, and he entered the Ashland Seminary Doctor of Ministry program in counseling in 2004.

Dan currently works at the Defense Supply Center Columbus as a contract administrator since 1982. He resides on the west side of Columbus with wife, Sherry, a breast cancer survivor whose battle continues. He has a married daughter, Jessica, with 2 grandsons, Joshua and Mark, living in Reynoldsburg.

KeyLeader Program scheduled ...

Kiwanis KeyLeader is a service leadership education program created and administered by Kiwanis International. All students in grades 8-11 are eligible to attend, and they do not need to be involved with a Key Club.

This is a great opportunity for your children, grandchildren, nephews or nieces. The spring KeyLeader Program will be May 15-17, 2009 at Recreation Unlimited in Ashley, Ohio (just north of Columbus). The cost is only \$175 per student (\$150 for Key Club members). Through individual members, our Club can sponsor as many students as we wish. The registration fee includes not only the KeyLeader program, but also 5 meals, 2 nights lodging, snacks and other miscellaneous incidentals. There are no hidden fees or extra expenses for your students. You can register a student at www.key-leader.org.

A second KeyLeader program is scheduled at the same camp facility for the weekend of November 13-15, 2009. Registrations for that program will be open later this summer.
