## Nannette Maciejunes

Executive Director  
Columbus Museum of Art



Nannette V. Maciejunes was named Executive Director of the Columbus Museum of Art in November 2003 after serving as the acting director for one year and as Chief Curator with administrative responsibility for the curatorial and registrars departments for ten years. She received the 2006 Governor's Award for the Arts in Ohio in the category of Arts Administration. In 2009, Nannette was named a YWCA "Woman of Achievement."



Ms. Maciejunes attended Stanford's Executive Program for Nonprofit Leaders—Arts in 2006 and the Getty's Leadership Institute for Museum Management (MMI) in 1999. She graduated *summa cum laude* from Denison University with a B.A. in Art History and an M.A. and further graduate studies toward a Ph.D. from the Ohio State University. She has been at the Columbus Museum of Art since she began as a curatorial research assistant in 1984, with a brief absence when she served as Curator of Collections and Exhibitions (1989-1990) at The Dixon Gallery and Gardens in Memphis. Her area of scholarly expertise is early twentieth-century American art.

Under her leadership, the Museum has adopted and implemented a new mission: To offer great experiences with great art to everyone. Ms. Maciejunes has also spearheaded the Art Matters Campaign to increase endowment and renovate and expand the Museum's building located in the Discovery District. She was instrumental in the acquisition of the Photo League Collection and the Schiller Collection of Art of Social Conscience. The Columbus Museum of Art was the setting for this year's Columbus Kiwanis Charity Auction.

*The Columbus Museum of Art offers a wide variety of programs for adult audiences of any experience level. Programs enhance visitors' appreciation of special exhibitions, particular artists, or art movements, as well as the Museum's permanent collection. Introductory lecture series are excellent starter programs for those new to the art museum experience.*

## Kiwansians in *Business First* ...

The May 15<sup>th</sup> issue of *Business First* highlighted two of our Club members, Jamie Richardson and Villie Grové.

Villie Grové is ranked 12<sup>th</sup> by *Barron's* in the list of Ohio's top financial advisors. Villie is a Senior Vice President with UBS Financial Services Inc – Grové Financial Group. His investment team manages assets totaling \$380 million.



Jamie Richardson was pictured on the front page of a special insert about the top 100 private companies in central Ohio. White Castle Systems Inc. is ranked number 13.

The article states that White Castle System Inc. adds five to 15 restaurants a year. It has

418 in 11 states. "We do that and pay for them as we go along, and don't take on debt to do it," said Jamie Richardson, the vice president of government and shareholder relations. "Even with this recent economy, we haven't had a single layoff based on tough conditions. It is very rare when we close a restaurant," he said.
