Martin Inglis Chairman of the Columbus Symphony Orchestra Board

Martin Inglis is Executive Vice President and CFO of Battelle, a global science and technology enterprise that develops and commercializes technology and manages laboratories for government customers. Headquartered in Columbus, Ohio, Battelle has a vast science and technology reach. Battelle, with the national labs it manages or co-manages, oversees 20,000 staff members and conducts \$4.2 billion in annual research and development. It counts as its successes the development of the Xerox® machine, pioneering work on the compact disc and medical technology innovations. In the area of commercial innovation, Battelle has spawned new ventures and companies in fiber optics, pharmaceuticals, energy, electronics and informatics. Battelle also manages or co-manages five of the U.S. National Laboratories for the Department of Energy - Brookhaven National Laboratory; Oak Ridge National Laboratory; Pacific Northwest National Laboratory; and National Renewable Energy Laboratory, and most recently Idaho National Laboratory.



Martin joined Battelle in October 2004 after a 32-year career with Ford Motor Company, most recently as Group Vice President-Business Strategy. Martin played a key role in Ford's global governance and strategy and in championing diversity and talent development processes. During his tenure at Ford, he held several key positions: Chief Financial Officer-Group Vice President; Head-Ford North America and Corporate Vice President; President-Ford South America and Corporate Vice President; Head-Global Product and Business Strategy and Corporate Vice President. In addition, Martin held posts in Ford Lio Ho-Taiwan and Ford Europe-Essex, England.

Martin earned his B.A. in Business Economics (with honors) from Strathclyde University in Glasgow, Scotland. Martin currently serves on the Board of Directors for the Alliance for Sustainable Energy, LLC; Brookhaven Science Associates, LLC; Battelle Energy Alliance, LLC; and Carpenter Technology Corporation, a NYSE-listed leading manufacturer and distributor of specialist alloys and engineered products. He is Chair of the Finance and Audit Committee of the LLCs and Chairman of the Corporate Governance Committee of Carpenter. Martin also is on the Advisory Boards of three venture capital companies: Fletcher-Spaght Ventures, L.C., Reservoir Venture Partners and Battelle Ventures. Martin is a member of The Conference Board Council of CFOs and is Chairman of the Columbus Symphony Orchestra Board.

- Port Authority Polo Shirt - \$25 – This pique knit sport shirt is soft, casual and a tried-and-true customer favorite. It is a shrink-resistant sport shirt, is easy to care for and just gets better-looking over repeated washing and wear. Both men's and women's styles are straight bottom hem with side vents. The fabric is 7-ounce, heavyweight pique of preshrunk 100% ring-spun combed cotton. The shirt features double-needle stitching, flat knit collar and cuffs, a locker patch and horn-tone buttons.

- Cutter & Buck Polo Shirt - \$36 – This lightweight, quick-drying shirt with DryTec is moisture-wicking, breathable and comfortable. The Women's shirt features a self-fabric collar, Y-neck placket with three-button closure, princess seams and curved hem with side vents. The fabric is 65% cotton / 35% polyester. The men's shirt features open half sleeves, double-faced collar, three button placket and straight bottom with side vents. The fabric is 60% cotton / 40% polyester.
