Elfi Di Bella is the president and CEO of YWCA Columbus, a position she accepted in January 2010. For the past 27 years, Elfi has been president of the Huntington Foundation and director of community affairs of Huntington Bancshares, Inc..

Elfi's insightful guidance led Huntington to many successful projects – such as heading up the community campaign to build the YWCA Family Center, and creating and instituting "Seeds for Growth" – a community resource workshop which provides professional development for nonprofit organizations.



Recognized as a "Woman of Achievement" in 2009 by the YWCA and a recipient of the American Red Cross Steckler International Service Award, Elfi is an active community leader and volunteer. She serves as a commissioner of the Columbus Community Relations Commission and is a trustee for Leadership Columbus and the Columbus Metropolitan Library Foundation.

Previously, Elfi has chaired the Community Shelter Board's Board of Trustees and served as chairman of the Strategic Steering Committee for CSB's "Rebuilding Lives" program, which has been recognized as a national model. Elfi has also held various leadership roles for Columbus School for Girls, Development Committee for Choices, Columbus Metropolitan Club, Jazz Arts Group, Columbus Sister Cities International and Columbus Arts Stabilization Committee.

Originally from Idar-Oberstein, Germany, Elfi earned a Bachelor's Degree in Business Management from Franklin University and is currently a member of the International Women's Forum.

Insect Control without Poison ...

Flies bothering you? Mosquitoes? Before reaching for the can of Raid that not only kills the <u>bad</u> bugs, but also the <u>good bugs</u> and is harmful to pets, birds and us as well, consider these alternatives:

Reduce the environment that is attractive to the insect. Place garbage in containers with tight-fitting lids. Cover worm farms and compost with insect screening.

Dark areas attract flies. Let the light shine in.

Isolate places or materials that attract insects.

Insect screens must be hole-free to be effective. Use a fly curtain made out of beads spaced closely together when people or animals are constantly passing through doorways.

Repel insects with natural items. Plant mint, lemon grass, marigolds catnip and chrysanthemums. Use citronella oil, crushed mint, and eucalyptus oil as repellents.

Trap insects. Use a fly trap. They work without insecticide. Fly paper. Just glue and flies.
