## Green School Year?

Homo sapiens are unique in their ability to transfer knowledge from generation to generation, thus allowing us to survive and thrive. As we approach the new school year, let's arm our children with some environmentally sound practices:

1. Green lunches
  - a. Use reusable containers for food rather than plastic one-use bags;
