

Timothy J. Boone is the current president of the Franklin County Trial Lawyers Association. He is a 1976 cum laude graduate of Capital University Law School, received his bachelor's degree in accounting from The Ohio State University in 1973, and is a graduate of both the National Institute of Trial Advocacy in Boulder, Colorado and the National College of Advocacy in Boston. Since 1991, he has served as adjunct professor of trial advocacy and advanced trial advocacy at Capital University Law School.



Mr. Boone has more than 30 years' experience as a civil trial lawyer, five of which concentrated in the area of agricultural chemical products liability defense litigating cases in federal and state courts throughout the United States. As a trial lawyer, he has handled a variety of claims including, wrongful death, professional negligence, railroad death/accident claims, medical negligence, aircraft product liability claims, business torts, contract litigation, toxic torts, defamation and intentional torts claims which fall outside the worker compensation statutes. Early in his career, he also defended minor felony and misdemeanor cases. Today, he prosecutes and defends business litigation, defends worker's compensation liability claims, employer wrongful termination claims and other employer claims, and he handles wrongful death, product liability, professional & medical malpractice, negligence, personal injury, contracts, and employment law claims in federal court, Court of Claims and state common pleas courts.

Please welcome Tim Boone to our Monday meeting on January 21.


## Singing Valentines ...

## Planning Underway for the Entrepreneurial Challenge ...

The Kiwanis Club of Columbus is pleased to offer 100 leading high school sophomores and juniors the opportunity to participate in the 35th Annual Kiwanis Entrepreneurial Challenge on Friday, February 22 at Columbus State Community College.

Formally known as the Entrepreneurial Forum, the Entrepreneurial Challenge will bring together Franklin County students, business professionals and community leaders for a full-day entrepreneurial workshop emphasizing creative thinking, financial literacy, problem-solving, public speaking, team-building and leadership skills. This will be an interactive and engaging event. Under the guidance of a Kiwanian (this is where 'we' come in!), each student will be placed into a group consisting of 10-12 students, called a "company."

In the marketplace, good ideas are not always good business opportunities. Before they can test the market, each "company" will create the item for preview - a prototype. During the Entrepreneurial Challenge, each company will consider, create and cost out an item for the local marketplace. The Challenge requires each company to:

- Invent a product targeted at local consumers
- Earn start-up capital to purchase raw materials
- Purchase raw materials
- Rent a toolbox for equipment to build their prototype
- Research & write a "mini" business plan
- Present their business plan before a panel of judges

Guest speakers will also be on hand to provide inspiration and information to participants, counselors and volunteers.

From our Club, we need 10-12 Kiwanians to serve as advisors that day, from 7:30 a.m. until 2 p.m. Advisors are loaned business professionals who act as business mentors to a company. As an advisor, you will facilitate a team-building activity and mentor your team as they complete the Creative Construction Competition. All advisors will attend a one-hour training session at 7:30 the morning of the 22nd at Columbus State Community College. Advisor training will provide you with all of the tools you will need that day for a fun and successful experience!
