Tom Hoaglin joined Huntington as President and Chief Executive Officer in February, 2001. He assumed the additional role of Chairman later that year. A banker for over 34 years, he worked for Bank One Corporation from 1973-99 and for AmSouth Bancorporation during 2000.

Born and raised in South Charleston, West Virginia, Mr. Hoaglin earned a bachelor's degree in economics, with high honors, from Denison University and an MBA from Stanford.

He serves as chairman of the Columbus Downtown Development Corporation and Capitol South Community Urban Redevelopment Corporation; Chairman of the Columbus Chamber of Commerce; and Chairman of OhioHealth. He is on the boards of The Columbus Partnership and CompeteColumbus. Hoaglin also serves as a trustee of Denison University and a director of AEP, The Gorman-Rupp Company and The Jeffrey Company.



Mr. Hoaglin and his wife, Ann, have been married for 33 years and reside in Columbus.



Planning Underway for the Entrepreneurial Challenge ...

Our Club has offered about 120 leading high school sophomores and juniors the opportunity to participate in the 35th Annual Kiwanis Entrepreneurial Challenge on Friday, February 22 at Columbus State Community College.

Formerly the Entrepreneurial Forum, the Entrepreneurial Challenge brings together Franklin County students, business professionals and community leaders for a full-day workshop emphasizing rigor, relevance and relationships. Each student will be placed into a group consisting of 10-12 students, called a “company,” and work under the guidance of a Kiwanian “advisor.”

Each company will consider, create and cost out an item for the local marketplace. The Challenge requires each company to:

- Invent a product targeted at local consumers
- Earn start-up capital to purchase raw materials
- Purchase raw materials
- Rent a toolbox for equipment to build their prototype
- Research & write a “mini” business plan
- Present their business plan before a panel of judges

Guest speakers will also be on hand to provide inspiration and information to participants, counselors and volunteers.

Our Club is already providing Kiwanian advisors Beltz, Pauken, Lindsey, Fisher, Stokes and Metcalf, who will work from 7:30 a.m. to 1:45 p.m. However, we still need six more folks to work registration & logistics or work with internship coordinators and then meet with students for a ‘power lunch.’
