Dr. Denvy A. Bowman, President Capital University

The Capital University Board of Trustees officially elected Denvy A. Bowman the University's 15th president in a unanimous vote earlier this year. He had served as interim president since June 2006. Bowman previously served as provost and vice president for academic affairs. He initially joined Capital in the summer of 2003 as Dean of the College of Arts & Sciences. The Board's vote was a culmination of months-long research and interviews completed by a special, board-appointed task force. The feedback made it clear that Bowman's collaborative leadership style, unwavering commitment to student- and academic-centered decision-making and his vision have earned the collective respect and confidence of those he will lead.

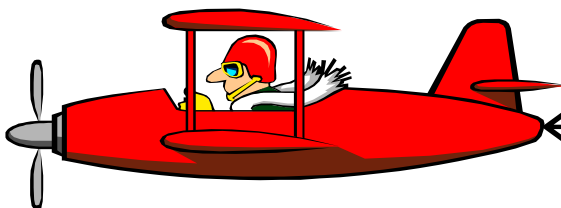


"This process has shown that the right person to lead Capital has been here all along," Board Chairman Roger Davis said. "Dr. Bowman has done an amazing job as interim president, demonstrating excellent leadership and grace under fire; building mutual respect among his colleagues; and becoming everybody's clear choice for president. We all agree that Dr. Bowman is the leader to build on our great heritage and move us forward into a bright future."

Before coming to Capital, Bowman was Dean of the Arts & Humanities Division at Keene State College in Keene, New Hampshire. Prior to that, he served as associate dean of the College of Humanities and Fine Arts at Coastal Carolina University in Conway, South Carolina. While there, he also served as Chair of the Department of History and the Director of the University Honors Program.

Bowman holds a doctorate in ancient history from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill; a master's degree in ancient history from the University of Virginia; and a bachelor's degree in history from Roanoke College.

Bowman resides in downtown Columbus. Please welcome Dr. Denvy Bowman at our upcoming meeting on the 17th.

Almost exactly a year ago we distributed our Club's "new" membership directory. As President-elect, I was responsible for the new book. For several

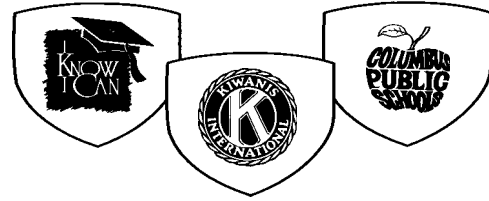
weeks I "buttonholed" members at Monday meetings, asking them to proof and correct their personal information. Those members that I wasn't able to speak with, I called on the phone. When at last I was certain the information was correct, Lorelee and I released the text to the printer. And you know what? By the time the directories were printed, they were already out-of-date.

Employers had changed. Residential and business addresses had changed. Phone numbers had changed. Even e-mail addresses had changed. A great deal of effort had produced a flawed directory that grew less reliable with every passing day.

When it was time to create this year's directory, I discussed my feelings with President-elect Sam Vogel. We couldn't continue to administer a 21st Century organization by employing 20th Century technology. We needed an on-line membership database that was both easily accessible and instantly updatable. After a few false starts, we are today rolling out just that thing.

Our partner in this process is a firm called Satori, Kiwanis International's endorsed vendor for club websites. Because they are an endorsed vendor, they must operate according to KI's rules, one of which is that members must opt-into the directory. Without your permission, no information other than your name will appear in the password-protected directory. You can pick and choose how much or how little of the information appears, including your photograph. And the next time any part of your data changes, you can update it yourself.

There will, of course, be a little confusion as we all learn to use the new site, but once the start-up hugga-mugga has passed, I think you'll find the new directory will be a huge advance over the old way of doing things. I plan to authorize all my data for inclusion in the directory, and I hope you will, too.
