

Impacting Lives - "Packing Parachutes" for People We May Never Know

**RICHARD J. ROLWING**

**"THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE"**

Richard J. Rolwing is a retired theologian who, after ten years' study beyond college, taught philosophy, world religions, and religion and politics at both small colleges and large universities. He has lectured before numerous professional organizations, both academic and business. His first book was "A Philosophy of Revelation According to Karl Rahner."



In 2001, he published Volume I of "My Daily Constitution," with Volumes II, III and IV having followed since then. Each of the four volumes has 365 essays, each about 365 words, on Uncle Sam's Birthright and Genealogy, the U.S. Constitution's philosophical and historical presuppositions and implications, or what Mr. Rolwing calls "Philosophy for Dummies."

He also published "Israel's Original Sin: A Catholic Confession," volumes I and II, the first of which focuses on the Mid-East conflict with a compelling critique of the theory and practice of Jews, Muslims and, above all, Christians, for following Joshua more than Jesus. Mr. Rolwing's second volume was a re-look at modern Israel's roots in ancient Israel, salvation history, biblical inspiration, partial revelation, imperfect theology and misguided leaders among Jews, Muslims and Christians.

Our multi-talented speaker on March 3 has been an insurance agent, a stock broker, an arbitrator and a registered financial planner. Moreover, he was also an executive vice-president of an equipment leasing company, an oil/gas drilling company and a gold mining company. Currently, Mr. Rolwing combines research and writing with rehabbing and re-selling real estate.

Come and listen to Richard J. Rolwing next Monday as he discusses the nuances of our Declaration of Independence from his perspective as an accomplished author and educator.



## Consumer Corner:

### Rumors about national Do-Not-Call list can confuse consumers ...



Some consumers have read that they need to renew their registration in the national Do-Not-Call list, which began in June 2003. While some reports indicated that registrations would begin to expire in mid-2007, all registrations are good for five years from the date of registration. Therefore, registrations are good at least until mid-2008, although consumers may renew their registrations at any time.

The federal government is considering whether to make Do-Not-Call registrations permanent, so that consumers would never have to renew so long as they keep the same telephone numbers. Consumers can write their member of Congress or to the Federal Communications Commission ([www.fcc.gov](http://www.fcc.gov)) to express their support. Meanwhile, the Federal Trade Commission has said it will not drop any telephone numbers from the list due to the five-year expiration until a final decision is made regarding permanent registration.

Consumers can verify when their telephone numbers were added by visiting [www.donotcall.gov](http://www.donotcall.gov) or by calling 1-888-382-1222 from the registered telephone number. If consumers renew their registration early, they will be on the Do-Not-Call list for five years from the date of renewal.

While more than 145 million telephone numbers have been registered to the national Do-Not-Call list, residential consumers who have never registered may sign up at any time using the above Web site and telephone number.

### Cellular telephones ...

Warnings have been sent out to consumers stating that if they do not add their cellular telephone number to the national Do-Not-Call list, it will be sold to telemarketers or placed in a national wireless directory. These warnings are false. According to the FCC, and other sources, it is illegal for telemarketers to place calls to cellular phones unless a customer has an established business relationship.

Since most telemarketing calls to a cellular phone are illegal, adding a cellular phone number to the national Do-Not-Call list should be unnecessary. However, consumers may add their personal cellular phone numbers to this list, as an added protection.
